MINUTES FROM ST. ANNE'S CHRISTIAN WOMEN'S MEETING

St. Anne's Christian Women met Tuesday, December 14th, at Mary Hall with 15 members present. The evening began at 6:30 p.m. with the group enjoying fellowship and refreshments while sharing a light evening meal. Membership filled a table with numerous baby items for Elevate Pregnancy Center (formerly Birthline) and personal care items for Place of Hope. They also surprised Char with a cake and song in acknowledgment of a milestone birthday she'll celebrate soon.

Following this, treasurer, Jean Schabel, (in absence of President Pat Salzbrun) opened the business meeting at 7:05 p.m. with an opening prayer and Pledge of Allegiance. Minutes from the November 9th meeting were approved as read. Also approved was the treasurer's report showing a checking balance of \$5,468.34 and savings balance of \$2,439.18 for a total of \$7,907.52.

Old Business:

November Breakfast... was highly successful with a total profit of \$4,264.84, our best ever, broken down as follows: Breakfast, \$1,227.09; Raffle, \$2,128.00; Bake Sale \$466.75; Craft Sale, \$353.00 and separate quilt raffle, \$90.00. Attendance was 220 (204 adults and 16 youth). Some of our increased profits likely resulted from the fact that we raised our adult breakfast price from \$8.00 to \$10.00 and raffle chance books were 20 per book. All in all, the breakfast went very well!

<u>Purchase of Teflon Pans and Spatulas for Kitchen...</u> as approved at our November meeting has been completed at a cost of \$56.76 (per word from Pat Salzbrun) with the pans already in use.

<u>Lenten Chaplets...</u> Supplies for making Father Statz's rosary chaplets are on hand. Pat will contact those who had shown interest as to when they'll get together to make them. Chaplets are to be ready for Lent which begins March 2nd.

1st Communion/Confirmation Gifts... As in the past, we'll continue to purchase gifts for our young people as they receive these sacraments. At present, we have 4 people who will receive 1st Communion on March 27th; we have no info yet as to Confirmation. Virginia Meyer will purchase these gift items; she'll be in touch with Char who has done the purchasing in the past.

No Resurrection Party in 2022... as no Mass is scheduled at St. Wendelin's on Holy Saturday, April 16th.

New Business:

<u>Donations...</u> As a result of our very successful breakfast, Treasurer Jean stated we had \$3,000.00 available to spend on donations. Following discussion, a motion was made and approved to donate as follows:

\$1000.00 to our St. Wendelin School

\$200.00 each to Poor Clares, Quiet Oaks Hospice, Pregnancy Resource Center, Anna Marie's Womens' Shelter, our St. Wendelin Quilters, our Faith Formation program for Catechesis of The Good Shepherd Atrium supplies and Jack Massmann, seminarian from SMHOC.

\$50.00 to our school for purchase of Christmas candy. Per membership decision, distribution of remaining funds designated for donation, will be determined at our April meeting.

Meeting adjourned at 7:42 pm with closing prayer by Jean. Evening concluded with membership enjoying a light hearted time of seasonal fun and games led by Lisa Lichte and music by Virginia Meyer.
