# FINANCE COUNCIL MINUTES Thursday, March 17, 2022

Unapproved Minutes

St. Wendelin's Finance Council held its meeting on Thursday, March 17, 2022 at 6:00 p.m. in the St. Wendelin's school library.

The meeting opened with a prayer lead by Todd Hurrle.

<u>MEMBERS PRESENT</u>: Jeanne Lommel, Todd Hurrle, Kelly Knier, and Trustees Erin Lommel, and Joe Watrin.

MEMBERS ABSENt: Lisa Lichte (excused)

#### **GUESTS PRESENT:** Kathy Watrin

#### **REVIEW OF AGENDA:**

The meeting agenda was reviewed. Discussion of the school budget was added to the agenda, and then a motion was made by Kelly, seconded by Todd, and carried unanimously to approve the agenda with that addition.

#### **REVIEW OF PREVIOUS MINUTES:**

The members reviewed the minutes from the February 3<sup>rd</sup> meeting. A motion was made by Kelly, seconded by Todd, and carried unanimously to approve said minutes.

#### **FINANCIAL REPORTS:**

The council reviewed only the financial summary due to focusing on the 2022/2023 budget this meeting. The church's fiscal year is July 2022 through June 2023. The maintenance costs were higher due to the purchase of a tractor with snow blower. The endowment funds performed well during 2021. A motion to approve the financial summary was made by Todd, seconded by Kelly. The motion carried.

#### PARISH BUDGET:

The 2022/2023 budget was reviewed, but won't need to be approved until the May meeting. The grade school subsidy is budgeted to decrease next year by \$5,000 to be \$150,000. The budget includes a possibility for adding a part time parish secretary to answer phones and help with other duties. Discussion was held on the telephone service as the expenses look high. The Faith Formation expenses are projected to be higher next year due to having the salary cost of the new Faith Formation directors for the full year instead of just a partial year.

**ACTION ITEM:** Todd will look into the phone bill and what services we are being charged for and if we can reduce the overall cost.

An increase for maintenance duties was approved by the Parish Council so we discussed the pros and cons of paying for this service from the school or the church budget. It was decided to keep him under the school since it will be easier for getting him a 1099.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

Tracy Dombrowski had asked for input in adding to a list of duties of the church and the contact information for the people in charge of the different activities. After discussion several items were added.

The school budget was reviewed. The \$150,000 subsidy was used to create their budget and everything balances including the extra for maintenance services. Their tuition is set for next year at \$2,775.

The meeting adjourned at 7:10 p.m. with a closing prayer lead by Todd.

#### I. Opening Prayer

Tracy Dombrovski led the opening prayer to begin the meeting.

#### II. Approval of Agenda

Motion was made to approve the agenda. Motion was seconded and passed.

#### **III. Approval of Minutes**

Motion was made to approve the minutes of the January 20<sup>th</sup>, 2022 meeting. Motion was seconded and passed.

#### **IV. Standing Committee Reports**

#### A. Finance

Jeanne Lommel reviewed the financial summary statements of the Balance Sheet and Income Statement for fiscal year-to-date through 12/31/21. Motion was made to approve the financial summary statements. Motion was seconded and passed.

#### **B.** Faith Formation

It was reported that the Faith Formation is going well. The talk from Father Erik and Father Zawadi on March 16<sup>th</sup> about their experience in assisting in building the school in Butembo, DRC was interesting and well received.

#### C. Holy Saints ACC

The ACC Pastoral Council had a meeting and voted to approve the by-laws on January 25, 2022 and will be in effect at the next Pastoral Council meeting. Next meeting will be March 29<sup>th</sup>, 2022. Father Matthew will discuss the Pastoral Council's next steps.

#### D. Catholic Community Schools (CCS)

It was reported that there was a budget review for all for the schools. Negotiations are ongoing for overall tuition policy. Tuition across all CCS schools is \$6400. Discussions to be had to determine what that may mean for the tuition for St. Wendelin's School in the future.

#### E. Maintenance

Keith Koltes distributed the current maintenance projects and gave the following update:

- Snow Removal Troy Thompson of PLM will be doing it again this year.
- Snow Shoveler Keith is taking care of this for the time being.
- Snow Shoveler Backup Steve Brang has agreed to do this if Keith is unavailable.

Church Interior Painting/Carpet - Keith is leading efforts to get bids. Project expected to take about 5 weeks, may need to take pews out to get a lift in. No bids in yet. Paulson and Maselter

bids are expected. Molitor Flooring to give a bid on carpeting. Conversation had to preserve the dedication crosses and candles on the side walls during the painting process.

Lawn mowing and lawn care for church/school grounds – Ron Albers & Virginia Meyer have agreed to take this on.

Break-in at school - Currently getting bids for a security system.

Tuck pointing in church basement and rectory basement – This project is approximately halfway done.

Hallways and Classroom Entryways at School – The maintenance committee to determine best remedy for the stained wall carpet.

- AED location -Lions Club suggested the location to be outside, on the right, front of the school.
- Pipe freeze issue Working to find a solution of too much soap going into the drain field and not dissolving due to it being anti-bacterial.

#### F. Envisioning Our Future Committee

Tracy distributed the minutes of the last Envisioning Our Future Committee held February 1, 2022. Jeanne Lommel reported to the group what the committee is tasked to do. The mission includes a vision for the preservation of the parish, school and community.

Tracy asked the committee members to stay as members through the fiscal year 6/30/2023.

#### **B. Parish Group Leaders**

Discussion about possibly reducing the number of groups from 5 to 4. Tracy Dombrovski to visit with Judy Walters to head a conversation.

### MAPLE GLAZED PORK SKILLET

1 Tbsp. extra virgin olive oil
1 lb. pork tenderloin, sliced ½" think
½ tsp. course sea salt
¼ tsp. course ground black pepper
½ cup maple syrup
2 Tbsp. spicy brown mustard
1 clove garlic, minced
2 cups petite carrots
4 cups broccoli florets
¼ head red cabbage, cored and thinly sliced

In a large skillet, heat 1 Tbsp. oil over medium heat. Season tenderloin slices with salt and pepper. Add to skillet. Cook for 6 to 8 minutes until brown, turning once halfway through. Remove slices and set aside.

In a small bowl, combine maple syrup, mustard, and garlic.

Add carrots to large skillet; pour in maple syrup mixture. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat, and simmer, uncovered, for 5 minutes.

Add broccoli and red cabbage. Stir to coat ingredients with glaze. Simmer for 3 minutes or until broccoli is tender, stirring frequently. Return pork to skillet and turn slices to coat in glaze. Serves 4
