I. Opening Prayer

Tracy Dombrovski led the opening prayer.

II. Approval of Agenda

Motion was made to approve the agenda. Motion was seconded and passed.

III. Approval of Minutes

Motion was made to approve the minutes of May 19, 2022 and June 13, 2022. Motion was seconded and passed.

IV. Standing Committees

A. Finances

Tracy stated that the Finance Council will be meeting next Thursday September 22, 2022 and she distributed the financial reports. Motion was made to accept the reports. Motion was seconded and passed.

B. Faith Formation/Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

Discussion centered around the date of First Communion (AFTER Easter) and the concept of each parish having their own First Communion Mass in lieu of having a common ACC Mass. Tracy will ask about this at the upcoming ACC meeting.

C. Holy Saints ACC

The next ACC meeting is scheduled for September 27, 2022.

D. Catholic Community Schools

No report was given.

E. Maintenance

Keith reviewed the maintenance listing and reported on the following: Exterior church windows are being sealed and painted, bids for a security system for the school are being reviewed, small water leakage in church and rectory (only after a heavy rain), crack filling, and checking the roof for possible hail damage.

F. Envisioning Our Future Committee

The committee will not be scheduling any meetings at this time; but will be keeping the membership intact for possible future meetings.

Tracy reported on the success of the festival.

VI. New Business

A. Mary Hall Rental Policy

Julie Kieke reviewed the current Mary Hall Rental Policy with the members. Discussion included kitchen supervision training (if kitchen is used), increase of rental fees, cleaning during the summer months, what is expected of renters prior to their leaving Mary Hall and who is eligible to rent the facility. Julie suggested the possible purchase of a floor scrubber. The following action was taken: Keith will look into the availability of a used floor scrubber. Tracy will follow up on the cleaners' summer schedule and what cleaning duties are to be done. Julie will update the St. Wendelin's Mary Hall Policy and Procedures document to include the revision in the Kitchen Supervisor section, the elimination of the second item under the Use of the Gym for Sporting Events and updating the rental fees.

B. Rec Club (Improvements-Paving)

Thais Kiffmeyer presented to the members a proposal to improve the driveway leading to the ball park area. Her proposal included tearing up and replacing the current drive, making the pavement twice as wide and possibly using temporary speed bumps which could be removed during the winter months. She explained that the project would cost approximately \$20,000 but it could be reduced by \$5,000 due to local workers assisting with the project. The Rec Club has agreed to pay half of the balance of \$15,000. Discussion followed regarding the funding of the other half of the balance, including getting funds from the parish and from local clubs. Members agreed this was a good idea and would enhance the property. Motion was made to advance this request to the Finance Council for their consideration. Motion was seconded and passed.

C. Parish Council/Finance Council Joint Meeting

The Parish Council/Finance Council will be meeting jointly on October 20, 2022 in the school library. Discussion followed regarding a possible Parish Life Committee to be formed to assist the Finance Council.

VII. Adjournment

Motion was made to adjourn the meeting. Motion was seconded and passed. The meeting was adjourned at 8:55 pm.

RECIPE CORNER

SOUTHERN APPLE CAKE

2 cups sugar

4 large eggs

1 cup vegetable oil

3 cups all-purpose flour

1 tsp. salt

1 tsp. baking soda

3 cups thinly sliced apple

1 cup chopped pecans or walnuts

Caramel Topping (recipe follows)

Garnish: pecan halves

Preheat oven to 325 degrees.

Spray a 13x9 inch pan with nonstick cooking spray. Set aside.

In a large bowl, beat sugar, eggs, and oil at medium speed with an electric mixer until smooth.

In a separate bowl, sift together flour, salt, and baking soda. Stir flour mixture into egg mixture until thoroughly combined

Add apple and nuts to batter. Gently stir until incorporated. Spread batter in prepared pan. Place pan in oven. Bake at 325 degrees for 50 to 55 minutes. Let cool in pan.

Pour warm Caramel Topping over cake in pan. Cut into squares and garnish with pecan halves if desired.

CARAMEL TOPPING

½ cup sugar
½ cup firmly packed brown sugar
4 Tbsp. butter
¼ cup evaporated milk
1 tsp. vanilla extract

In a small saucepan, bring sugars, butter, and evaporated milk to a boil over medium-high heat. Cook, stirring constantly, for 2 minutes. Stir in vanilla.
