# MINUTES FROM ST. ANNE'S CHRISTIAN WOMEN'S MEETING

St. Anne's Christian Women met Tuesday, October 11, 2022 in Mary Hall, beginning with social time/refreshments at 6:30 p.m. followed by President Karen DesAutels calling the business meeting to order at 6:45 p.m. with opening prayer and pledge of allegiance. Twenty one members were present.

Minutes from the September 13<sup>th</sup> meeting were approved as read; also approved was the treasurer's report showing a balance of \$965.74 in checking and \$2,439.92 in savings for a total of \$3,405.66.

# **Old Business:**

**By-Laws...** President Karen went over point by point the proposed changes as membership followed along with their copies. After discussion and revisions from the floor per some of the proposals, motion was made and approved to accept the by- laws which will be filed along with a copy of the changes that were made.

**Remembrance Mass and Reception...** is set for Sunday, November 6<sup>th</sup> at which 9 deceased parishioners will be remembered at our regular 10:00 a.m. Mass. Immediately following the Mass, a continental breakfast of rolls, juice and coffee will be served. Volunteers were enlisted to help with the reception.

<u>Our Annual November Fundraiser Breakfast...</u> is set for Sunday, November 20<sup>th</sup>. The menu will remain the same as in the past with serving from 8:30 to noon. The morning will also include a raffle and bake and craft sale. Adult breakfast price will remain at \$10.00 but children's price will change (per motion made and approved) from \$4.00 for ages 5-12 to \$5.00 for ages 5 thru 10. Major duty areas were assigned as follows: Food Ordering and Pick up, Lisa Lichte; Flyer and Publicitiy, Karen DesAutels; Worker's List, Pat Salzbrun and Raffle, Char Volkmuth. Other details will be finalized at our November meeting.

Also, our St. Wendelin Quilters have again donated a quilt for a separate raffle which will be set up in the bake sale area. Ticket price will be \$2.00.

Corporal Works of Mercy Monthly Project... In response to September's "Feed the Hungry, Give Drink to the Thirsty", members brought in "Mercy" bags of items to be given to Place of Hope which helps shelter the homeless in our area. For October's "Clothe the Naked", members are encouraged to bring new and or gently used clothing items to next month's meeting, also new socks for men/women/ children. These socks will be given to our school for their "Socktober" sock collection.

Per note from September's meeting, Cyntia Lommel checked with Place of Hope who gave her various options for providing a meal at the Center, likely sometime in December. Once that date is set, she'll be in touch to finalize the details with those who showed an interest in helping.

# PORKCHOPS WITH SAUERKRAUT, APPLE & ONION

#### **INGREDIENTS**

Pork chops (boneless or bone-in and thickness of choice)

1 Tablespoon of Avocado oil or oil of choice

1 32oz. jar of sauerkraut, drained.

1 Honeycrisp apple (or other firm apple), sliced 1/4 inch thin

1 Onion, sliced thin

4 Red potatoes, sliced to 1/2 inch thick cubes\* optional

Seasoning of choice or just Salt & Pepper

#### **DIRECTIONS**

Preheat oven to 325\* F.

Heat oil in a large skillet over high heat.

Pat pork chops dry with a paper towel. Season the pork chops on one side. When the oil is very hot, place pork chops seasoned side down in skillet. Season the other side of the pork chops while they are cooking on the one side.

Let sear until golden brown, about 2-3 minutes and flip. Sear on this side for 2-3 minutes more.

Remove pork chops from the skillet. Use an ovenproof skillet or 9 x 13 baking dish layer potatoes, apple and then the onion in the skillet. Pour the sauerkraut over the pork chops.

Cover the skillet or baking dish with an ovenproof lid or tin foil.

Bake for one hour or until pork chops are fork tender. This will vary depending on the thickness of your pork chop. Starting check at 45 minutes for thin pork chops.


