RECIPE CORNER

MARRY ME CHICKEN

1/2 box linguine 3-4 Boneless Skinless Chicken Breasts 1 tsp. kosher salt 1/2 tsp. black pepper 6 Tbsp. flour 2 Tbsp. Extra virgin olive oil 2 Tbsp. butter 1 small shallot, peeled & thinly sliced 3 cloves garlic, minced 1/2 tsp. dried thyme 1/4 tsp. oregano 1/4 tsp. red pepper flakes 3/4 cup chicken stock 1 cup heavy cream 2 handfuls baby spinach ¹/₂ cup freshly grated parmesan cheese 1/3 cup sun-dried tomatoes in oil

Prepare pasta according to pkg directions; keep warm.

Preheat oven to 375 degrees.

Season chicken evenly on both sides with salt and pepper, dredge in flour, shake off excess.

In a large cast iron skillet, heat oil and butter over medium-low heat; sauté chicken in oil until dark golden-brown, turning once (about 2 minutes per side).

Move chicken to a warm platter; keep warm. Add shallot to the skillet; cook until tender (1-2 minutes), stirring constantly.

Add garlic thyme, oregano and red pepper flakes; cook and stir for 30 seconds.

Add chicken broth, then cream.

Stir in spinach, cheese and tomatoes; cook until sauce is bubbly and starting to thicken (about 5 min) stirring often.

Return chicken to skillet, flip chicken to coat in sauce.

Bake chicken in preheated oven until cooked through (15-18 min).

Serve chicken over warm pasta.
