RECIPE CORNER

SHRIMP SCAMPI WITH ORZO

¹/₂ lbs. peeled and deveined, medium shrimp (tails removed) 1 Tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil 2 tsp. lemon zest, divided 1/8 tsp. red-pepper flakes 1/2 cup minced onion 1 tsp. Kosher salt 1/4 tsp. black pepper 1 tsp. thinly sliced garlic 2 Tbsp. unsalted butter, divided ³/₄ cup orzo 1/2 cup white wine 2 cups chicken stock 2 Tbsp. drained capers 2 Tbsp. finely chopped parsley Grated parmesan cheese and lemon wedges, to serve

In a medium bowl, gently stir together shrimp, olive oil, 1 tsp. lemon zest, and red pepper; cover and let stand at room temperature for 15 to 20 minutes.

In a 10 inch cast-iron skillet, melt 1 Tbsp. butter over medium heat. Add onion, garlic, salt, and black pepper. Cook, stirring occasionally until onion is softened and translucent, about 5 minutes. Stir in broth and wine; bring to a boil. Stir in orzo; cook, stirring occasionally, for 5 minutes. Reduce heat, and simmer and cook until orzo is al dente, about 7 minutes.

Stir in shrimp mixture and capers. Cook, stirring occasionally until shrimp are pink and firm, about 5 minutes. Stir in remaining 1 Tbsp. butter; sprinkle with parsley and remaining 1 tsp. lemon zest. Serve immediately with parmesan and lemon.
