Dear St. Wendelin Catholic School and Parish Community,

Catholic Community Schools of the Diocese of St. Cloud (CCS) and St. Wendelin Catholic School in Luxemburg have reached an agreement for the school to return to being a parish parochial school. The change was announced on May 1, 2023 to the staff of St. Wendelin and CCS.

The decision for the school to separate from Catholic Community Schools was made by the CCS Board of Directors after discussion with the leadership of St. Wendelin Parish. This decision was made in the interest of the long-term visions for both CCS and St. Wendelin School.

With academic excellence being a pillar of both St. Wendelin Catholic School and CCS, this decision allows each to place greater strategic focus on their respective curricula — a thriving Montessori program in the case of St. Wendelin, and a more standardized curriculum model in the case of CCS.

The CCS Board of Directors recommended the change to the CCS Corporate Board. The change was approved and became effective May 1, 2023.

CCS and St. Wendelin will continue to work together over the coming months to assist the school in transitioning to its new status. With the well-being of students, families, and staff of the St. Wendelin community in mind, the goal is to prevent or minimize disruption to daily operations as we work together during this transitional period.



#### RECIPE CORNE

#### PECAN-HERB-CRUSTED PORK WITH PLUMS

1 Tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil

2 plums, pitted & cut into 6 wedges each

1 small red onion, cut into ½" wedges

2 tsp. kosher salt, divided

2/3 cup finely chopped pecans

2 Tbsp. plain dry bread crumbs

2 Tbsp. firmly packed light brown sugar

2 Tbsp. minced fresh basil

3/4 tsp. ground black pepper, divided

1/4 tsp. garlic powder

1 large egg

1 Tbsp. Dijon mustard

1 (1-to 11/4 lbs) pork tenderloin, trimmed

Garnish: fresh basil leaves

Preheat oven to 400 degrees.

In a large skillet, heat oil over medium heat. Add plums, onion, and ½ tsp. salt, turning to coat with oil, and cook for 2 minutes. Remove from heat. Push plums and onions to edge of pan to make room for pork.

In a shallow dish, stir together pecans, bread crumbs, brown sugar, minced basil, ½ tsp. salt, 1/4 tsp. pepper, and garlic powder. In another shallow dish, whisk together egg and mustard. Sprinkle pork with remaining 1 tsp. salt and remaining ½ tsp. pepper. Dip pork in egg mixture to coat, letting excess drip off. Dredge in pecan mixture, completely covering pork. Place pork in prepared pan, moving plums and onions around pork.

Bake until an instant-read thermometer inserted in thickest portion of pork registers 145 degrees, 20 to 25 minutes. Let stand for 10 minutes before slicing. Garnish with basil leaves, if desired.

Makes 4 to 6 servings
