#### MINUTES FROM ST. ANNE'S CHRISTIAN WOMEN'S MEETING

St. Anne's Christian Women met Tuesday, September 12, 2023 in Mary Hall, beginning with social time/refreshments at 6:30 p.m. followed by President Karen DesAutels calling the business meeting to order at 6:45 p.m. with opening prayer and pledge of allegiance. Twenty one members were present.

Minutes from the May 9th, 2023 meeting were approved as read; also approved was the treasurer's report showing a balance of \$2,002.48 in checking and \$2,445.10 in savings for a total of \$4447.58. Treasurer Stacey also noted that per her recent request for Masses to be said for a deceased member, due to the limited number of Masses available, only one will be said here; the other two were sent to the Poor Clares.

The evening began with Guest, Deacon Dan Dullinger, speaking, on Eucharistic Revival, the program launched in the U.S. in 2022 in response to statistics showing a large number of Catholics no longer believe in the Real Presence. In an effort to restore understanding and devotion to the Eucharist, this 3 year program focused last year on the diocese, this year on parishes and next year will be on Mission. Deacon Dan encouraged all to learn more by going to the website, Eucharistic Revival.com. He closed his remarks saying the culmination of this effort should be that each member go out and INVITE SOMEONE BACK TO THE CHURCH as well as be a PRAYER WARRIOR for the cause.

After his presentation, Deacon Dan then gave his blessing to our **two 50 year members, Sandy Leach and Sandie Weber**, who were given certificates and honored at this meeting. The members gave both of these ladies a warm, congratulatory applause. Following this, all present took time to enjoy cake and refreshments including Deacon Dan. Before he left, President Karen presented him with a gift and a halo which acknowledged all he does as a disciple of Christ. He also thanked the Christian Women for their work, saying all we do really does make a difference.

<u>Remembrance Mass...</u> will be Sunday, November 5th at our 10:00 a.m. Mass. Currently we have 7 deceased who will be honored. President Karen recruited volunteers to help with the reception following Mass.

<u>Meeting Concluded...</u> with sharing of numerous thank you notes received; members were encouraged to go to our diocesan website, stclouddccw.org, to check out the latest diocesan newsletter "Our Catholic Voice" and finally our two 50 year members were given another hearty round of applause.

**Adjournment at 8:15 p.m**...with closing prayer and Prayer Partner Exchange; daily prayer this month is to pray for our prayer partner. Next meeting will be Tuesday, October 10th in Mary Hall, fellowship at 6:30 pm and meeting at 6:45 p.m.

#### RECIPE CORNER

Ron Albers

It is apple season and canning season. This is a very flavorful, easy recipe for a great use of your apples. It is delicious on bread, cream cheese and crackers or to put over ice cream. Enjoy!

#### **BOURBON MAPLE APPLE JAM**

3 quarts chopped, peeled, cored apples (about 6 lbs or 18 medium sized apples) 1 package Sure-Jell (powdered pectin) 1 tsp. cinnamon ½ tsp. allspice ½ tsp. nutmeg ¼ tsp. ground cloves 6 cups sugar

1 cup maple syrup ½ cup bourbon

Combine apples, Sure-Jell, and spices in a large stock pot. Bring slowly to a boil and cook 10 minutes, stirring often, until apples have softened.

Stir in sugar and maple syrup and return to a rolling boil. Boil hard for one minute. Remove from heat and carefully stir in ½ cup bourbon (mixture will bubble and splatter, so be very careful).

Ladle hot jam into hot jars, leaving ¼ inch head space. Process in boiling water bath for 10 minutes.

Remove jars and let cool undisturbed on your kitchen counter for 24 hours. Jars are sealed when button in the middle of the lid is fully depressed.

Store in your pantry up to one year. Open jars need to be refrigerated.

Makes 5 pints or 10 half-pint jars.
