RECIPE CORNER

Ron Albers

RHUBARB COOKIES

1 2/3 cup all purpose flour

34 tsp. kosher salt

½ tsp. baking powder

½ tsp. baking soda

1 $\frac{1}{4}$ sticks (10 Tbsp) unsalted butter, room temperature

2/3 cup packed light brown sugar

1 large egg plus 1 large egg yolk

1 tsp. pure vanilla extract

1 cup white chocolate chips (about 6 oz)

1 cup walnut halves (about 4 oz) roughly chopped

1 ½ stalks rhubarb (about 4 oz) chopped into ¼ inch pieces

1 Tbsp flaky sea salt

Sift the flour, kosher salt, baking powder and baking soda together in a large bowl.

Beat the butter and brown sugar in a large bowl with an electric mixer on medium-high until light and fluffy, about 3 minutes. Beat in the egg and yolk, then beat in the vanilla.

Reduce the mixer speed to low. Add the dry ingredients and beat until well combined, about 1 minute. Fold in the chocolate chips and walnuts, then fold in the rhubarb. Cover the bowl with a clean dish towel and refrigerate the dough for at least 1 hour or up to overnight.

Preheat the oven to 375 degrees. Line 2 baking sheets with parchment paper.

Use a 1 oz ice cream scoop to scoop the dough onto the prepared baking sheets, spacing about 2 inches apart. Sprinkle the sea salt on top of the dough balls.

Bake, rotating the baking sheet halfway through, until the cookies are golden around the edges but still soft in the middle, 14 to 16 minutes. Let cookies cool for 10 min on the baking sheet, then transfer to a wire rack to cool completely, about 30 minutes.

Even at this late hour, members were encouraged to keep praying and continue contacting legislators to vote "NO" on the proposed legislation. Char also thanked the membership for their \$500.00 donation to MCCL last month which MCCL has put to excellent use via TV commercials and newspaper ads "pushing back" against the proposed legislation.

ADORATION AT THE CAPITOL

Over the years, I have taken part in Eucharistic Adoration at various churches and chapels. But never did I dream I would ever do it at our state capitol in St. Paul. Yet, back on Friday, May 3rd, that is exactly what I did, along with Karen Des Autels and Virginia Meyer. If you've never heard of Adoration at our capitol, you are not alone. Most people have not. I, too, was totally unaware until early this year when I received a phone call from a parishioner at MIC in Rockville, telling me about this Adoration which takes place at our capitol each first Fri. of the month, 9 to 4, during the time the Legislature is in session, and that a group from MIC goes regularly. Greatly, but happily, surprised, I then shared this info at our April CW meeting and was pleased that Karen and Virginia took up my suggestion to attend the Adoration on May 3rd.

So on that beautiful May Friday morning, the three of us made our way to St. Paul. All went well though upon arriving at the parking lot, we encountered a bit of uncertainty as to whether we were parked in the correct lot. Pondering our next move, we were amazed but oh so happy to see a foursome from MIC in Rockville (a God ordained moment the three of us agreed) who quickly assured us we were, indeed, parked in the right place. After that, we happily followed them to the correct entry door and thru a maze of halls/passageways and an elevator that eventually led us to the Adoration Chapel located in the capitol's lower level.

The small room (capacity 22) is actually the historic "Governor's Dining Room" built in 1936. Chosen for its intimate chapel like feel, it has simple, cream colored walls with a mural of a northern MN river on one side. Upon entering and signing in, we then seated ourselves and focused our attention on our reason for being there, the monstrance on the white covered table up front with candles on either side. **SIMPLE, YET PROFOUND! JESUS TRULY PRESENT!!!** My prayers over the next hour plus, centered on praying for enlightenment for our legislators, especially in light of the upcoming proposed legislation relative to abortion and religious liberty, as well as gratitude that we still have the freedom to hold this type of worship. Last but not least, I said a prayer of thanks for all those responsible for making it happen.

Speaking about those who make it happen, that credit goes to MCC (Minnesota Catholic Conference) which is the church's public policy voice for our state. Jason Adkins, head of this group, stated, "MCC has long wanted to bring the Blessed Sacrament to the MN capitol." He believes MN is the only state where the Eucharistic Lord is adored regularly INSIDE its Capitol building. In addition he stated "It's a way of asking Christ to exercise His Lordship over the state; Christ's Real Presence makes an impact, giving people the opportunity to pray for their elected officials at their place of work, while also nicely complimenting the Church's on going Eucharistic Revival movement.

As I researched more, I found there was much to learn, including, to my surprise that this was already the **2**nd **year** Adoration was taking place with plans to do the same come next January. MCC has had no problem reserving the space which is available for the public to rent. Nearby area priests take turns exposing and reposing the Blessed Sacrament, closing each time with Benediction. MCC staff members assist as needed with a member always present during adoration. So far, happily, there have been no negative incidents or objections; it would seem that Jesus, Himself, is watching over and blessing this adoration time.

Who actually comes? 
