RECIPE CORNER

Fall is here and with the weather being so nice we still have a few things left in our gardens to use up. Here is a recipe that is great if you like peppers and still have a few left.

STUFFED PEPPERS

4 large bell peppers (any color)

1 lbs. lean ground beef

2 Tbsp. chopped onion

1 cup cooked rice

½ tsp. salt

1 clove garlic, finely chopped

1 can (15 oz) organic tomato sauce

3/4 cup shredded mozzarella cheese (3 oz)

Heat oven to 350 degrees.

Cut thin slice from stem end of each bell pepper to remove top of pepper. Remove seeds and membranes; rinse peppers. If necessary, cut thin slice from bottom of each pepper so they stand up straight. In a 4-quart Dutch oven, add enough water to cover peppers. Heat to boiling; add peppers. Cook about 5-7 minutes; drain.

In a 10-inch skillet, cook beef and onion over medium heat 8 to 10 minutes, stirring occasionally, until beef is brown; drain. Stir in rice, salt, garlic and 1 cup of tomato sauce; cook until hot.

Stuff peppers with beef mixture. Stand peppers upright in ungreased 8-inch square glass baking dish. Pour remaining tomato sauce over peppers.

Cover tightly with foil. Bake 15 minutes. Uncover and bake about 12-15 minutes longer or until peppers are tender. Sprinkle with cheese.

Serves 4.

(If you make your own homemade marinara sauce you can use that instead of tomato sauce. Has a lot more flavor).

The thought of serving sweet breads with rolls was brought up by Karen, volunteers willingly agreed to bring in various choices. Char reported that letters of invitation w/rsvp to families of the deceased will be going out by 10/12/24. She also stated the earlier count of nine is inaccurate as one was buried in St. Augusta and will be celebrated with their parish, so planning Remembrance Mass for 8. Karen stated set up will happen the day before, any help is welcome on Saturday, 11/2/24. - Lisa asked about jelly, discussion ensued that it is not needed.
- Pat Salzbrun suggested serving alcoholic beverages as Rockville parish had done recently with great success. After some discussion it was decided not to pursue this at this time.

We asked Cassie to follow up with Knights of Columbus and the Luxemburg Lions for donations before we commit to an amount. After discussing our monetary commitment, a motion was made to place a cap on our donation of \$500, motion was seconded and passed.
