PATRONAL FEAST DAY

At our 10 a.m. Mass on Sunday, October 19th, we will remember our patron, St. Wendelin (554-617) whose feast day is October 22nd.

Born in Scotland in 554 to a royal family, Wendelin surrendered his crown and fled his homeland, going to Rome for an audience with Pope Benedict I, then eventually to Germany where he chose to live the austere life of a hermit. After several years, he became a shepherd for a nobleman near Trier. Various miracles and healings are attributed to him during these years in light of his life of simplicity and prayer. In 597, following the death of the abbot of the Benedictine monastery in Tholey, Germany, Wendelin reluctantly agreed to serve as abbot. Thus he's often depicted in Benedictine habit (miter on the ground as a sign of his humility) while also holding a sheep or shepherd's staff, (see statue in the back of our church) symbolizing both his earthly and monastic work. Another older carved wooden statue, is encased in our church front display case. This historic 16 inch figure was carried from Germany to America in the mid 1800's by Peter Maus, ancestor to generations of Maus families in our parish. History states that Peter, attributing his safe ocean crossing to St. Wendelin, promised to erect and name a church after him...thus our St. Wendelin Church.

Wendelin died in 617 and is widely venerated especially in the Diocese of Trier, Germany, as well as in Austria, Switzerland and his native Scotland.

I have been teaching using this method for about 25 years, and I love it because it ensures that all students are challenged, and no student is expected to learn things they are not ready to learn yet. This approach helps eliminate the boredom and frustration that can be present in a traditional classroom. I'm looking forward to this year and all the exciting challenges and adventures it will bring!

RECIPE CORNER

PEACH DESSERT

CRUST

¾ cup sugar
1 ¼ cup flour
¼ tsp baking soda
¼ tsp salt
½ cup butter
1 tsp vanilla
1 egg

CREAM CHEESE FROSTING

12 oz. cream cheese¼ cup butter1 tsp. vanilla1 ¼ cup powdered sugar

PEACH GLAZE

4 large ripe peaches peeled and chopped
1 cup water
1 cup sugar

1 cup sugar

3 Tbsp. cornstarch

1 Tbsp. lemon juice

2 Tbsp. butter

Make the Crust: Mix the butter, sugar, egg, and vanilla until well combined. (You can use an electric mixer or just mix with a spoon if your butter is melted.) Add flour, baking powder, and salt. Mix until combined. Chill the dough for 30 minutes.

Bake the Crust: Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Line a 9x13 pan with parchment. Roll the chilled dough out in pan. Bake for 20-25 minutes. Allow it to cool.

Make the Cream Cheese Frosting: Using an electric mixer, combine the cream cheese, butter, powdered sugar and vanilla until smooth and creamy. Spread over the cooled cookie crust and chill again to firm up the frosting.

Make the glaze: In a medium-sized pot, mix together the peaches and water. Cook for 4 minutes over medium heat. Add the sugar and cornstarch and cook until clear. It will thicken up and be a nice thick glaze. Remove from heat and add the lemon juice and butter. Stir until the butter is melted and then let the mixture cool. Spread over cream cheese filling. Refrigerate until glaze is cooled.


