ADVENT

The new liturgical year begins with the First Sunday of Advent. In the beginning weeks of Advent the readings focus on the end times placing the coming of Christ within God's plan for salvation. The last weeks focus on the coming of Christ at Christmas.

The Advent wreath is made from evergreen branches with four candles to represent the four weeks of Advent. The purple candles for the first, second and fourth Sundays remind us to pray, do penance and good works. The rose candle used for the third Sunday symbolizes rejoicing.

The Jesse Tree represents the family tree of Christ as a member of the royal family of King David, whose father's name was Jesse. Each day an ornament or symbol is added to the tree representing a family member, event or prophecy.

"Advent, which prepares us for Christmas, is a time of expectation and hope in which we focus our attention on our encounter with Jesus, first during our life and then at its end when we will meet him face to face."

Here is a good way to use up some of your leftover turkey especially on these cold days.

ANYTIME TURKEY CHILI

2/3 cup chopped sweet onion 1/2 cup chopped green pepper

1-1/2 tsp. dried oregano

1 tsp. ground cumin

1 tsp. olive oil

2 garlic cloves, minced

1 can (16 oz) kidney beans, rinsed and drained

1 can (15-1/2 oz) great northern beans, rinsed and drained

1 can (15 oz) pumpkin

1 can (15 oz) crushed tomatoes

1 can (14-1/2 oz) reduced-sodium chicken broth

1/2 cup water

2 Tbsp. brown sugar 2 Tbsp. chili powder

1/2 tsp. pepper

3 cups cubed cooked turkey breast Shredded cheddar cheese, optional

In a large saucepan, sauté the onion, green pepper, oregano and cumin in oil until vegetables are tender. Add garlic; cook 1 minute longer.

Stir in the beans, pumpkin, tomatoes, broth, water, brown sugar, chili powder and pepper; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer for 1 hour. Add turkey; heat through. If desired, top with cheddar cheese.
